- 5. Please name at least three mitzvot that we learn from the first paragraph of Shema:

- b. Say the Shema,
- c. Teach the Torah to your children
- 6. Instead of Moshe, who would lead the Jewish people into Israel? Yehoshua bin Nun
- 7. How did הר סיני look when Hashem gave the Torah to the Jewish people? Fiery. There was thunder and lightning.
- 8. What two things does Moshe warn the Jewish people not to do when they enter ארץ ישראל?
- a. Not to forget Hashem's laws
- b. Not to worship idols like the other nations that live in the land.

- 10. What Mitzvah in our parshah is only for boys, and not for girls? The *mitzvah* of *teffilin*
